Arctic Biodiversity Assessment recommendation themes most prominently addressed in the session:

- Climate change
- Mainstreaming biodiversity
- Improving knowledge and public awareness

Key points raised in the session that were important to note:

- 35 young leaders from the Arctic and observer countries at the Arctic Youth Summit
- Climate change affects the living conditions of Arctic youth in several ways
- A common declaration has been formulated and will be handed to the Ministers
- More action is needed and cooperation of Arctic youth with leaders in all contexts
- Young people are not only future leaders but current leaders
- It is crucial to mitigate anthropogenic climate change
- Climate change is no longer a future issue but a current issue
